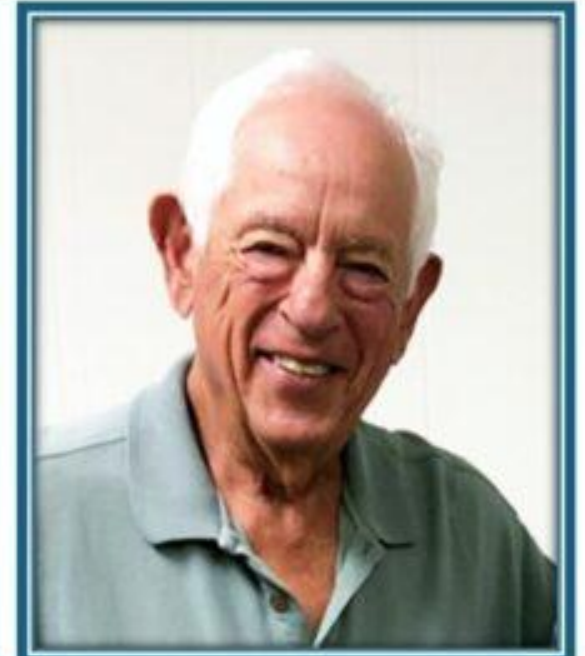

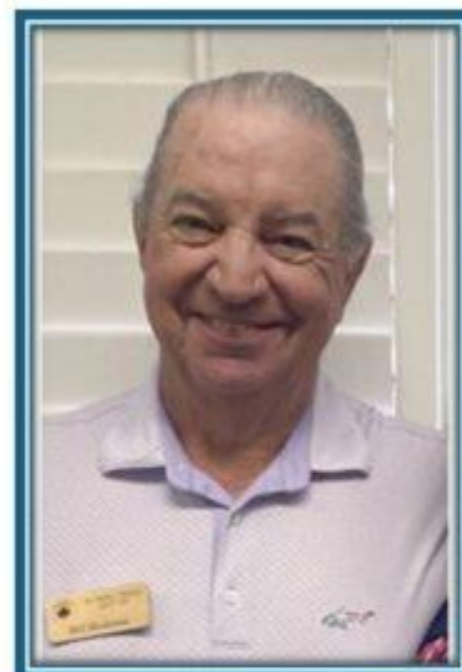

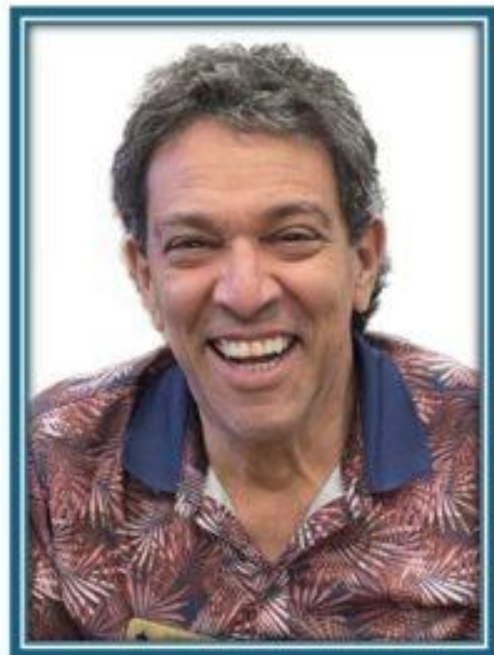

JANE & ROBERT WARACH

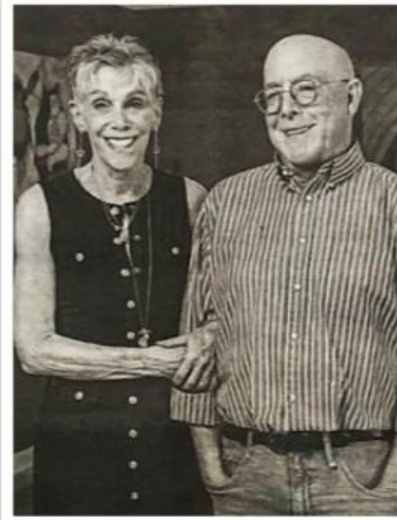
Jane and Robert Warach take every opportunity to make a difference with everyone they meet. “We can’t save the world, but we can do the best we can to help the people around us.” Robert said.

Jane Horowitz and Robert Warach grew up on opposite sides of the tracks – Jane from North Jersey, Robert from South Jersey.

“We met (working) at a summer camp for children with special needs,” he said. “My mother saw me eating breakfast at 2 in the afternoon and said, “You’re not sitting here all summer. Go find a job.”

The couple dated through their college years. Jane earned her undergraduate degree from Simmons College and a Master’s degree in Special Education from Boston University. Robert received his bachelor’s and master’s degrees from Syracuse University in New York and earned his law degree from St. Mary’s University in San Antonio. The couple married on July 4, 1971.

The Warachs moved to El Paso in 1975 and raise their three daughters: Rachel; Sarah; and Kate. It didn’t take long for Jane to make history by co-founding the first female-owned accounting firm in the city. She is still a practicing CPS. Robert practiced law for 50 years before retiring, specializing in probate, real estate planning, guardianship, and mental health “When I retired, I didn’t want to continue to be on boards and committees anymore. I’ve done that. I’d rather be



hands on now,” Robert said. “Two days a week I work at a food pantry and teach GED classes.” Jane added: “I’m not ashamed to admit that I don’t mind writing checks, and we’ve always donated but Bob is more hands-on.”

The Jane and Robert Warach Family Fund was started at the El Paso Community Foundation to contribute to causes with a social benefit. “With this fund at the El Paso Community Foundation our children will always have input on making El Paso a better place for years to come,” Robert said.

Jan and Robert’s Great Gift to El Paso is their lifelong commitment to giving back, one person at a time. As empty-nesters, Jane and Robert are doing more than sitting around all summer. Mom would be proud.



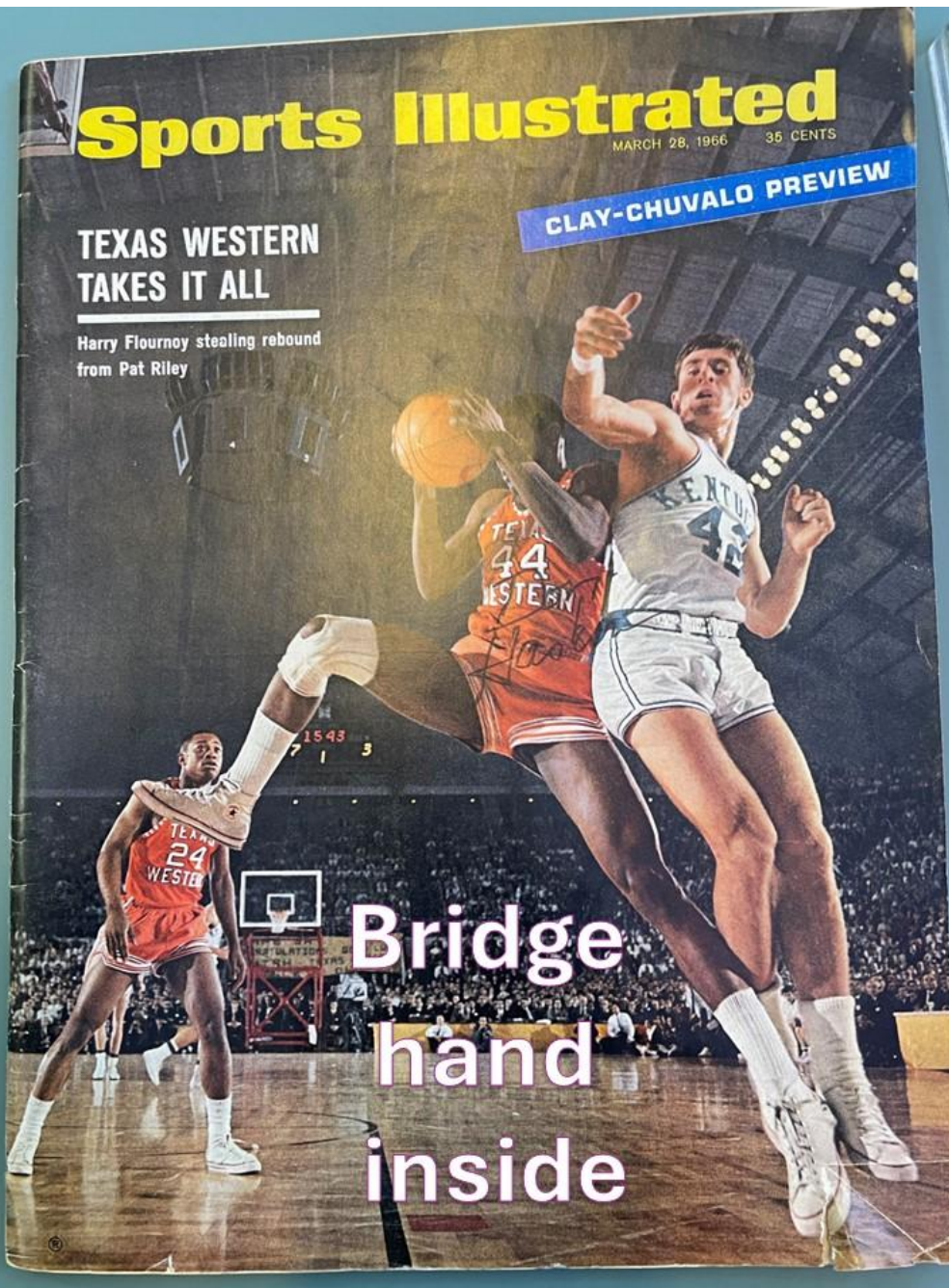
